# GENERAL INFORMATION

Inclusion on the Judges' List will be at the discretion of the Judges Sub Committee after scrutiny of Judges' Questionnaires. Nomination for inclusion on the Club's Judges' List are invited annually and reminders are listed on Breed Club internet websites, on Social Media and from Committee members. The lists are compiled annually, when unsuccessful applicants may re-apply.

## CRITERIA 2015

### A1 List

For persons who have previously been approved by The Kennel Club to award CCs in the breed and have the support of the Club and to have fulfilled the criteria for the A2 and A3 List.

# A2 List

For persons who fulfil all the requirements for the A3 List and who have been assessed in accordance with The Kennel Club requirements and accepted by The Kennel Club for inclusion on an A2 List and have the support of the Club.

#### A3 List (Breed Specialists)

### Requirements include:

- Minimum of 10 years judging experience in the breed is required and have the support of the Club.
- To have judged both sexes at the same United Kingdom Breed Club show and to have judged the breed at 25 shows or 125 classes with an adequate geographical spread.
- 3 To have judged a minimum of 500 dogs.
- 4. To have bred and/or owned a minimum of 3 dogs in the breed when they obtained their 1st entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book (save in exceptional circumstances).
- 5. To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer, and passed the relevant examination on Kennel Club Regulations and Judging Procedures
- To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer on Conformation and Movement
- To have passed the Conformation Hands On assessment given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer
- To have attended at least one breed specific seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed an examination and/or assessment where applicable
- To have stewarded at 12 shows, or to be approved to award Challenge Certificates in another breed.

# A3 List (Non Specialists)

### Requirements include:

- 1 Minimum of 10 years judging experience in any one breed (to include 8 years in this breed) and have the support of the Club.
- To have judged both sexes at the same United Kingdom Breed Club show and to have judged the breed at 25
  - Open shows or Championship shows without CCs with an adequate geographical spread.
- To have judged a minimum of 125 classes in this breed.
- 4 To have judged 500dogs in this breed.
- To have been approved to award Challenge Certificates in his/her original breed before awarding CCs
- To have stewarded for a minimum period of 3 years and at 12 shows.
- To have bred and/or owned a minimum of 3 dogs of any breed when they obtained their 1st entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book (save in exceptional circumstances).
- 8. To have attended at least one breed specific judging seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed an examination and/or assessment where applicable

### B List (Breed Specialists)

- To have 5 years experience owning and exhibiting in this breed and have the support of the Club.
- To have judged 5 shows with the minimum of 25 classes of this breed at Open shows or Championship shows without CCs and 5 years judging experience in the breed
- To have attended at least one breed specific seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed an examination and/or assessment where applicable

### **B List (Non Specialists)**

- 1 Minimum of 10 years judging experience in any one breed and have the support of the Club.
- To have judged 50 classes of this breed at Open shows or Championship shows without CCs (save in exceptional circumstances) over a period of 6 years.
- To have attended at least one breed specific seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed an examination and/or assessment where applicable

### C List

For breed specialists who have owned and exhibited the breed for 5 years and for aspirant judges who have demonstrated an interest in the breed and have the support of the Club.
